

INTRODUCTION

The Education Statistical Digest is an annual publication of the Corporate Planning Unit of the Department of Education, Innovation and Gender Relations (DOEIGR). The 2019 Digest analyses data reflecting the academic year, which commenced in September 2018 and ended in July 2019. This Digest depicts trends and projections in various sub-sectors of the education system. The Digest can be used by Policy Makers, Planners, Researchers and other personnel to make rational assumptions and sound decisions for the education system in Saint Lucia. Copies of the Digest can be requested from the DOEIGR or found on the Department's website, www.education.gov.lc.

The production of this Statistical Digest commenced with the distribution of the Annual Education Census Questionnaires to public and private schools at all levels specifying that data reported must reflect what existed on October 15, 2018, unless otherwise specified. Additional sources of data included the Central Statistical Office, the Government's Annual Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure and the various units of the DOEIGR.

The 2019 Digest highlights data on various constituents and components of the education sector. It reports on student enrolment, dropouts, repeaters and graduates. Data are included on teachers, local and regional examinations, education financing and student welfare programmes. The data compiled are used to calculate indicators which are necessary to monitor the progress of numerous targets and goals such as the monitoring indicators for the 2015-2020 Education Sector Development Plan. These indicators are used by the DOEIGR and National Government as well as regional and international agencies such as the OECS, Caribbean Development Bank, World Bank, UNICEF and UNESCO. They assist in the monitoring, evaluation and review of the education system's progress in achieving its targets and goals for example Education for All (EFA), Millennium Development Goals (MDG) and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The DOEIGR is grateful for the assistance provided by education officers, principals and other ministry personnel. We look forward to your continued cooperation in the provision of accurate and timely data for future publication and the advancement of our education system.

SUMMARY

Early Childhood Education (ECE)

Early Childhood Education Centres provide services to children within the age range of 0-4 years. However, there are instances where older children attend these centres. ECE centres are categorized as daycare centres and preschools. Daycare centres provide child care services to children 0-2 years old while preschool centres provide services to children who are 3-4 years old. The target age groups and services offered by these institutions may overlap. Both are encouraged to follow the structured curriculum prescribed by the Early Childhood Services Unit of the DOEIGR. As new schools open and others close, the number of centres may fluctuate from year to year.

Day Care Centres

For the academic year 2018/19, there were thirty-seven (36) daycare centres; one (1) less than the previous academic year. Daycare centres are both Government and privately owned. There was an increase of one (1) centre at the Government-owned and a decrease of two (2) centeres at the private centres compared to the previous year. The total enrolment was one thousand, three hundred and thirty- seven (1337) students, a decrease of 3.2% in contrast to the previous year. Government-owned centres recorded an increase of 2.8% and privately owned centres recorded a decrease of 9.7% in enrolment. The male to female student ratio remained the same at 1:1 when compared to the previous year, whilst the caregiver to student ratio slightly increased from 1:10 to 1:11. The Castries region continued to record the highest student enrolment, six hundred and sixteen (616), which represents approximately 46.1% of the daycare population.

Preschool Centres

There were ninety-four (94) preschools in operation during the 2018/19 academic year. This figure remains the same as that of the previous year. All preschools centres are privately owned. These centres enrolled three thousand, five hundred and four (3504) students, which represents

twenty-two (22) students more than the previous year. Of the total enrollment figure, approximately 50% were female. The teacher/student ratio increased from 1:10 to 1:11, but the average number of teachers per centre decreased to three (3) when compare to the previous year. The gross enrollment rate for the year 2018/19 was 84.4%.

Public Primary Education

Primary education is compulsory for all children and the formal school age ranges from five (5) to eleven (11) years. There was a 1.2% decrease in enrolment from fourteen thousand, eight hundred and ninety-four (14,894) in 2017/18 to fourteen thousand, seven hundred and fifteen (14715) in 2018/19. There has been a consistent decline in primary school enrolment over the last eighteen years. This can be partly attributed to a steady decline in the school-aged population over the past years. The male to female student ratio remained at approximately 1:1.

The gross enrolment rate increased from ninety-five percent (95%) in 2017/18 to ninety-six percent (96%) in 2018/19. The net enrolment rate in public primary schools remained the same as the previous year. There continues to be a number of under-aged and over-aged students in the primary schools. For 2018/19, the percentage of under-aged students was 23.9% and over-aged students was 14.2% of the public primary population. Forty-two (42) of the students enrolled in early childhood institutions were five year olds. There were five hundred and ten (510) students who were ten and eleven years old enrolled in secondary schools.

In 2018/19, the recurrent expenditure for primary education remained the same as that of the previous year (XCD 63.2 million). Since 1997, the unit expenditure per student has been increasing and 2018/19 show no difference in this trend. This period registered an increase of 1% taking the amount to four thousand, two hundred and eighty-four Eastern Caribbean dollars (XCD 4284).

School leavers are students who have left school by way of dropouts and transfers out of Saint Lucia. At the public primary schools, there were three (3) dropouts and one hundred and twenty-four (124) transfers during the academic year 2017/18. This represents a decrease of five (5) students who dropout and an increase of thirty-eight (38) students who transferred out of Saint

Lucia from the previous year. In 2017/18, males accounted for 33% of the dropouts and 66.13% of the transfers.

In 2018/19, there were four hundred and twenty-three (423) repeaters at public primary schools of which fifty-nine percent (59%) were boys. It is noteworthy that there was a decrease of 5.8% in the number of repeaters from 2017/18 to 2018/19. The majority of the repeaters were students of Grade K (201 students) and Grade Six (60 students). At the district level, the highest percentage of repeaters was recorded in District One.

The Student Support Services Unit of the DOEIGR provides assistance in the form of a book bursary and the School Feeding Programme to needy students in public primary schools. One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five (1955) or 13.3% of the students from public primary schools benefited from book bursaries in 2018/19. Seventy (70) of the Saint Lucia's seventy-four (74) public primary schools have a School Feeding Programme. For 2018/19, six thousand one hundred and fifty-six (6156) students or approximately 42% of the public primary school students benefited from this Programme. District Seven recorded the highest percentage (76.8%) of students benefiting from the programme while District Two recorded the lowest percentage (13.5%) of beneficiaries.

The National Common Entrance Examination (CEE) is a primary school exit exam written annually by Grade Six students. In 2019, two thousand two hundred and seventy-two (2272) students wrote this exam, an increase of forty-eight (48) students as compared to 2018. Of the students who sat the CEE, one thousand one hundred and seventy-four (1174) or 52% were males. The national mean was 60.1% which was the same as that for the year 2018. One thousand one hundred and fifty-two (1152) or 51% of the students scored at or above the national mean.

National assessments are also conducted in Grade Two and Four. These assessments, called the Minimum Standard Exams, comprise of a school based assessment (SBA) component. The SBA has a weighting of 20% of the overall assessment score. For 2018/19, one thousand, one hundred and sixty-two (1162) students or about fifty-six percent (58%) of the one thousand nine hundred

and eighty-nine (1989) candidates scored at or above the minimum standard of 60% at the Grade Two level while one thousand and forty-two (1042) or 49.8% of the Grade Four students scored at or above the minimum standard of 60%. The national composite means for the Grade Two and Grade Four national assessments were 62.8% and 58.9% respectively.

For the academic year 2018/19, there were one thousand and thirteen (1013) public primary school teachers, which is an increase of nine (9) teachers over the previous academic year. The percentage of female teachers decrease from eighty-six percent (86%) in 2017/18 to eighty-five percent (85%) in 2018/19, which represents a 1% decline. The total number of trained teachers slightly decreased from nine hundred and seven (907) in 2017/18 to nine hundred and five (905) in 2018/19. District Five recorded the highest percentage (94%) of trained teachers while District Four and Eight recorded the lowest percentage (86%).

Over the past years, in an effort to improve the quality of education in the primary sector, along with regular classroom teachers, specialist teachers were assigned to public primary schools. Areas of specialization include Special Education, Music, French, and Physical Education. Where the capacity and resources are available, other specialist teachers are assigned to teach other areas, e.g. Information Technology, Theatre Arts and Spanish. In 2018/19, a total of two hundred and sixty-three (263) specialist teachers were recorded. In addition to the normal teacher-student ratio, an effective teacher-student ratio was calculated which does not include these specialist teachers. The average teacher-student ratio in public primary schools in 2018/19 was 1:15 while the effective teacher-student ratio was 1:20.

Public Secondary Education

In 2018/19, there were twenty-two (22) public secondary schools in operation. This figure remained unchanged from the previous year. For the period under review, eleven thousand and two (11002) students were enrolled in Form one to Five at the public secondary schools; a decrease of 3.8% from the previous year. The male to female student ratio remained at approximately 1:1. The formal age of students attending public secondary schools is twelve (12) to sixteen (16) years.

The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) and Net Enrolment Ratio (NER) were eighty-eight percent (88%) and eighty percent (80%) respectively in 2018/19. It must be noted that there were four hundred and eighty-nine (489) students who are between 12-16 years old enrolled in primary schools and at the special education centres, which affected the secondary school NER.

For 2017/18, there were two hundred and forty-five (245) school leavers. This figure includes students who dropped out of school and those who transferred out of Saint Lucia. The number of dropouts increased from one hundred and sixty-one (161) in 2016/17 to two hundred and four (204) in 2017/18. As in the previous years, the male dropout rate was higher than that of females. Males accounted for approximately sixty-five percent (65%) of the total dropouts. Forms Four and Five continue to record the highest percentage of dropouts accounting for eighty-seven percent (87%) of the total dropouts.

The recurrent expenditure on secondary education in 2018/19 was XCD 73.1 million, an increase of 0.7% from the previous year. This resulted in the expenditure per pupil also increasing from six thousand, two hundred and seventy dollars (XCD 6270) in 2017/18 to six thousand, five hundred and seventy dollars (XCD 6570) in 2018/19.

A total of one thousand and two (1002) teachers were attached to secondary school teachers in 2018/19, which is four (4) less than the previous year. Seventy-four percent (74%) of these teachers were trained, which is a lower percentage than the 89% recorded for primary school teachers. Out of the one thousand and two (1002) teachers, seventy percent (70%) were female and sixty-nine percent (69%) were graduate teachers. As in the previous year, the public secondary school teacher-student ratio remained at 1:11.

The Transportation Subsidy Programme and the School Feeding Programme are two welfare programmes offered to students attending public secondary schools. Of the eleven thousand and two (11002) students enrolled at public secondary schools, two thousand, three hundred and eighty-one (2381) students or twenty-two percent (22%) benefited from the Transportation Subsidy Programme. The School Feeding Programme was available at five (5) of the twenty-two

(22) secondary schools. A total of two hundred and fifty (250) students were beneficiaries of this programme.

Private Primary and Secondary Education

In 2018/19, the number of private primary and secondary schools remained the same, six (6) and two (2) respectively. The six private primary schools were Tapion, Bonne Terre, Montessouri, Castries SDA, Labayee SDA, and Emmanuel SDA. However, the International School St. Lucia reported having students enrolled in a primary program. A total enrolment of nine hundred and seventy-eight (978) students and six-eight (68) teachers were recorded at the six private primary schools, which gave a teacher-student ratio of 1:14. For the period under review, the percentages of female students and female teachers were approximately fifty-one percent (51%) and ninety-one percent (91%) respectively. The Castries SDA once again recorded the highest enrolment for the year.

In addition to the two (2) private secondary schools, SDA Academy and the International School St. Lucia, the Bonne Terre Preparatory School reported having students pursuing a secondary programme. The total private secondary schools' enrolment decreased from two hundred and forty-two (242) in 2017/18 to two hundred and thirty-six (236) in 2018/19. The total number of teachers also decreased from thirty-two (32) in 2017/18 to twenty-seven (27) in 2018/19. Fifty percent (50%) of the students and seventy percent (70%) of the teachers were female. The teacher-student ratio was 1:9. The SDA Academy recorded sixty-nine percent (69%) of the total enrolment of the private secondary schools.

Secondary School Exams

Aside from their regular class assessments, students at the secondary level also sat other examinations. In 2011, one of the local examinations, the Form Three Minimum Standards was discontinued and replaced with the Caribbean Certificate of Secondary Level Competence (CCSLC) examination. CCSLC assesses students' competence in six subjects namely; English, Mathematics, French, Integrated Science, Social Studies and Spanish. The quality of grades is measured based on three competency levels; Master, Competent and Developing Competence. In

2019, five percent (5%) of students achieved competence at the "Master" level, fifty-nine percent (59%) at the "Competent" level and thirty-six percent (36%) at the "Developing Competence" level.

The Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC) Examination, which is typically done at the end of students' standard secondary education, registered an overall pass rate of 76.8% at the General and Technical Proficiency levels in the 2019, which was a 0.3% increase over 2018. There were increases in the pass rates achieved at twelve (12) of the twenty-two (22) secondary schools with increases ranging from 0.2% to 70%.

Special Education

Special education centres in Saint Lucia cater for students with special needs including developmental and sensory impairments. Specialized education programmes are delivered at five (5) centres across the island namely the Blind Welfare Association, Lady Gordon Opportunity Centre, Dunnottar School, Soufriere Special Education Centre and Vieux Fort Special Education Centre. The total student enrolment and total number of teachers for 2018/19 were three hundred and ninety-five (395) and seventy-five (75) respectively. Thirty-nine percent (39%) of the students enrolled were female. The teacher-student ratio at the special education centres decreased from the previous year to 1:5. There were fifty-four (54) trained teachers in 2018/19, which is an increase of three (3) teachers from the previous year.

Skills Training

The National Skills Development Centre (NSDC) offers services and training in a variety of areas such as career counseling, technical vocational skills training, job search workshops and job attachments and placements. In 2018/19, three hundred and seventy-two (372) trainees were enrolled at the NSDC. Of these, one hundred and fifty (150) were enrolled as self-funded students, one hundred and fifty-two (152) were enrolled under the Productivity Enhancement Training (PET) and seventy (70) enrolled under the Information Technology Fundamentals (IT) Programme. Two hundred and eighty (280) or sixty-nine percent (75%) of the trainees were females. Sixteen (16) tutors were employed at the centres, out of which nine (11) were females.

The Centre for Adolescent Rehabilitation and Education (CARE) also provides technical and vocational skills training and has four (4) centres located across the island. In 2018/19, CARE had an enrolment of one hundred and seventy-four (174) students, which was a twenty-seven percent (27%) increase from the previous year. Seven percent (7%) of the student population was female. The teacher-student ratio was 1:10. Skill courses are normally offered in the second and third years of the programme. In 2018/19, fifty-eight (58) or thirty-three percent (33%) of the students were enrolled in these courses.

National Enrichment and Learning Programme (NELP)

The National Enrichment and Learning Unit (NELU), which is responsible for the NELP, offers this Programme in two phases. In 2018/19, students were able to access the courses under NELP from sixteen (16) centres, the same as the period 2017/18. The total enrolment at these centres was one thousand, five hundred and nine (1509), which is a seven percent (7%) decrease from the previous year. Females represented approximately 69% of the total learners from both phases. The programme with the highest enrolment was CSEC Mathematics with two hundred and ninety-seven (297) learners enrolled.

Phase One utilized fifty-three (53) facilitators and had a facilitator-learner ratio of 1:12. During this phase, there were forty-six (46) dropouts recorded. There were Four hundred and eleven (411) learners who graduated from Phase One with approximately seventy-four percent (74%) being females. Phase Two utilized seventy-seven (77) facilitators. The facilitator-learner ratio was 1:11. Seventy-eight percent (78%) of the facilitators from both phases were female.

Post-Secondary and Tertiary Education

Post-secondary and tertiary programmes are offered at Sir Arthur Lewis Community College (SALCC), Vieux Fort Post-Secondary Department, Vieux Fort Comprehensive Secondary A' Level Department, Monroe College, UWI Open Campus and three offshore Medical Schools namely: The International American University (IAU) College of Medicine, American International Medical University (AIM-U), Spartan Health Sciences University School of Medicine.

Sir Arthur Lewis Community College (SALCC)

The SALCC offered a wide range of post-secondary and tertiary education programmes. In 2018/19, the enrolment was one thousand, nine hundred and ninety (1,990) compared to one thousand, eighty hundred and sixty-six (1,866) in 2017/18. This meant a 7% increase in enrollment. The Department of Technical Education and Management Studies (DTEMS) recorded the highest enrolment (57% of the 1,990 students enrolled). It must be noted that the enrollment figure does not include students registered at the Department of Continuing Education (DOCE). The DOCE offers many courses including the Defensive Driving and other stand-alone courses at the CSEC level.

Vieux Fort Post-Secondary Department and Vieux Fort Comprehensive A' Level

In 2014/15, the Vieux Fort Post-Secondary Department, which was previously located on the compounds of the Vieux Fort Comprehensive Secondary School Campus B, was relocated to the site where the Vieux-Fort Comprehensive Secondary School (VFCSS), Campus A was previously located. However, the A' Level department continued to be housed at the VFCSS. The Post-Secondary Department offers Business, Secretarial and Carpentry/Joinery programmes to secondary school graduates. The 2018/19 enrolment at the Vieux-Fort Post-Secondary was one hundred and twenty-three (123) with the majority (59%) of the students enrolled in the Business Studies programmes. In 2018/19, there was an enrolment of one hundred and twenty-three (123) students at the Vieux Fort Comprehensive A' Level Department.

Monroe College

Monroe College opened its doors in Saint Lucia in 2007. The College offers undergraduate and graduate programmes. The College recorded an enrolment of two hundred and fifty-five (255) students and nineteen (19) teachers in the 2018 Fall (September to December) semester. One hundred and twenty-six (126) or seventy-four percent (74%) of the students were female. The Bachelors in Business Management recorded the highest enrolment accounting for thirty-three percent (33%) of the student population.

Medical School

The three above-mentioned offshore medical schools operating in St. Lucia offer four and five years medical programmes including MD (Doctor of Medicine) programmes. In 2018/19, data were received from only one out of the three schools namely the Spartan Health Sciences University School of Medicine. A total of two hundred and ninety-four (294) students were enrolled in 2018/19, which marks a twenty-three percent (23%) increase from the previous year. The majority of students enrolled in these programmes were from India (70%) followed by St. Lucia then the Nigeria. Twenty-eight (28) teachers worked with this schools of which approximately twenty-nine percent (29%) were employed full time. Males represented sixty-eight percent (68%) of the total number of teachers.

Tertiary Level Examinations

Students from the SALCC and A' Level Department of the VFCSS wrote the Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examinations (CAPE) in 2019. The overall pass rate at SALCC was 97 % in Unit 1. This represents an increase of 0.2 percentage point from the last year. The pass rate attained for Unit Two was 95.9%. VFCSS attained a pass rate of 87.18% in Unit One and 95.79% in Unit Two. This represents a decrease of 8.82 and an increase of 3.01 percentage points respectively over the year 2018.

Education Financing

For the financial year 2018/19, one hundred and eighty-two point one million dollars (XCD 182.1) was allocated to the DOEIGR for recurrent expenditure. This represented approximately 15% of the 2018/19 national budget of recurrent expenditure, a 3% increase over the previous year. Thirty-nine point six percent (39.6%) of Education's budget was allocated to secondary education, thirty-four point two percent (34.2%) to primary education, eight point five percent (8.5%) to tertiary education and approximately one point four percent (1.4%) to ECE. In 2018/19, the Department's expenditure as a percentage of GDP was at 3.6%, a slight decrease of 0.3 percentage points from the previous year 2017/18. From 2005/06, Education's recurrent expenditure as a percentage of total government recurrent expenditure has been less than twenty percent (20%).

Teacher Attrition

During the 2017/18 academic year, forty-five (45) primary and eighteen (18) secondary school teachers left the service due to resignation, termination, retirement and secondment among other reasons. The percentage of teacher leavers at the primary schools decreased by 12% percentage points from the previous year while that of secondary schools decreased by 70% percentage points. In 2018/19, there were seven (5) primary school teachers on study leave, all being on study leave without pay. This represents a slight decrease of three (5) teachers over the previous year's number of eight (10) teachers on study leave. At the secondary schools, twenty-two (22) teachers were on study leave; three (3) more than the previous year. The teachers on study leave included students enrolled at the Division of Teacher Education and Educational Administration of the SALCC. Approximately fourteen percent (14%) of secondary school teachers on study leave were males.

Culture

Cultural groups and activities existing at schools are highlighted in the annual Digest. It was noted that four cultural groups existing at schools included, La Rose, La Marguerite, Steel Pan and Quadrille. School choir singing competitions are held at both the primary and secondary levels.

Technical Notes on Concepts and Methods

1. Age Specific Enrolment Ratio (ASER)

- ➤ The ASER gives information on the extent of participation of specific population ages in a specific level of education.
- ASER at secondary level has been calculated by relating the population, ages 10 to 19, to the enrolment of these ages in secondary schools.

2. Average Class Size of a Grade or School

This is the total enrolment of a grade or school divided by the total number of classes in that grade or school.

3. Dropout Rate

➤ The Dropout Rate is calculated by relating the number of students who dropped out during a given year to the enrolment in the beginning of the year.

4. Expenditure per Pupil/Student

Expenditure per pupil/student is calculated by dividing total expenditure allocations to a given level of education by the enrolment at that level.

5. Female Participation Rate

The percentage share of females in the total enrolment is computed to determine gender participation at a given level of education.

6. Flow Rate

- Flow Rate is calculated by following a cohort of students who join a given class in a given year and move to the next class in the subsequent year.
- ➤ When using flow model technique for projection of enrolment, flow rates are used for carrying forward students from one class in a given year to the next class in the subsequent year.

7. Graduate Teachers

A graduate teacher is a teacher with at least a recognised bachelor's degree.

8. Gross Enrolment Rate (GER)

➤ The GER gives information on the extent of participation of a specific school-going age group population in a specific level of education.

- \triangleright GER at primary level is calculated by relating population in age group 5 11 to the enrolment in primary schools.
- \triangleright GER at secondary level is calculated by relating population in age group 12-16 to the enrolment in secondary schools.

9. Infant, Junior Primary, Senior Primary

10. Infant, Primary and Combined Schools

11. Net Enrolment Rate (NER)

- ➤ The NER gives information on the extent of participation in a given level of education of children belonging to the official age-group corresponding to the given level of education.
- NER at primary level has been calculated by grade (from K to grade 6), by relating the population in ages 5 to 11 to the enrolment in those grades.
- NER at secondary level has been calculated by form (1 to 5), by relating the population in ages 12 to 16 to the enrolment in those forms.

12. Percentage of Repeaters

Percentage of Repeaters is calculated by dividing the number of students repeating in a current year by the total enrolment of that year, expressed as a percentage.

13. Reference Point/Period

- > Population: Population data are given for the middle of the calendar year.
- Enrolment: Student data are given for the last school day of October of a given academic year.
- ➤ Teachers: Teacher data are given for the last school day of October of a given academic year.
- Expenditure: Financial data are given for the financial year from April to March of the following year.
- > Gross Domestic Product (GDP): GDP data are given for the calendar year.

14. Repetition Rate

➤ Repetition Rate is the number of students repeating from a particular year divided by the total enrolment in the previous year.

15. School Capacity

- ➤ Physical capacity of a school is estimated at 35 pupil/students per classroom and 15 square feet per child in case of hall spaces.
- ➤ If enrolment of a school is more than its capacity then it is a case of over utilization of physical capacity.
- ➤ If enrolment of a school is less than its capacity then it is a case of underutilization of physical capacity.

16. School Size

- The size of a school is measured in terms of number of pupils/students enrolled on the last school day of October of a given year.
- Average size of a school is computed by dividing total enrolment by number of schools in a given area.

17. Teacher Utilization

- ➤ Child/Teacher ratio is the number of children per teacher in a Pre-school centre.
- ➤ Pupil/Teacher ratio is the number of pupils per teacher in a Primary school.
- ➤ Student/Teacher ratio is the number of students per teacher in a Secondary school.
- ➤ The above ratios are calculated by dividing total enrolment by the total number of teachers in the school/centre.
- ➤ The Principal, Vice Principal, Counselor, Lab Technician and Bursar of a school are not included in the number of its teaching staff.

18. Trained Teachers

A trained teacher is one who has successfully completed a recognized program in teacher education methods and teaching techniques.

Note: TIIIB teachers who pursued the Special Intensive Teacher Training Program were counted as trained teachers from 2007/08.

19. Transition Rate

- > Transition Rate is calculated by relating the number of graduates who join the next level of education in a given year to those who graduated from the lower level in the previous year.
- > Transition from primary to secondary level is calculated by relating the number of students who sat the CEE in a given academic year to the intake in Form 1 in the secondary schools during the next academic year.


















Table 67: Percentage of Students Benefiting from the School Feeding Program in Public Primary Schools by District, 2018/19














